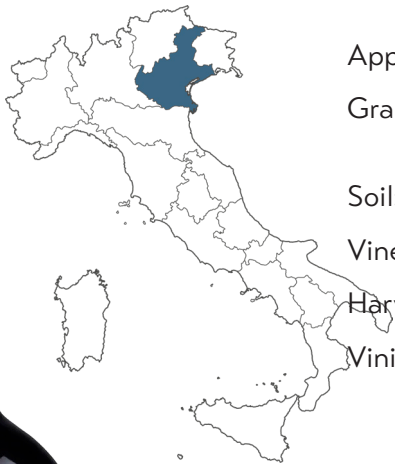




Capitel San Rocco

The wine is produced with grapes selected in the Marne bianche vineyard in Maternigo estate. The wine is obtained according to the ancient technique of Ripasso, in other words, through the refermentation of one part of Valpolicella wine produced in October on the marc of Amarone and Recioto.

This is an elegant wine that is complex and reflects the style of the family. It is round, but dry, and is a great protagonist of the territory that expresses its worth full heartedly. It is suitable for ageing and for food pairings.

Grapes:	Corvina 35%, Corvinone 35%, Rondinella 20%, Other varieties 10%
Soil:	Red clay and limestone of moraine origin
Vineyard:	20 years (average)
Harvest:	End September – Beginning October
Vinification:	Destemming and Pressing. Alcoholic fermentation and clarification. Slow alcoholic fermentation on the marc of Amarone and Reicoto 8–10 days at 18°C
Maturation:	14 months (Slavonian Oak)
Bottling:	6 months bottle ageing
Alcohol:	14,5%
Sugars:	1,5 g/l
Total acidity:	6,4 g/l
Dry Extract:	35 g/l

A perfumed ripasso with nervy aromas of pepper, dried flowers, fresh stems and a touch of raspberries. The palate is medium- to full-bodied, agile and lively, with stimulating freshness accompanied by subtle, well-delineated red fruit. The balance between freshness and fruit drives this wine. Drink now.

Wine Spectator – 91

A sleek red, defined by fine, taut tannins, this offers a lovely range of fig cake, dried cherry and rosemary, and mocha flavors. Showing concentration without excessive weight, this is minerally on the fresh, focused finish. Corvina, Corvinone, Rondinella and Rossignola. Drink now through 2031. 8,400 cases made, 500 cases imported.

VINTAGE 2020

Quite a stern, savory nose with only a hint of the mixed dried and fresh berries that open up on the palate. This is medium-bodied, tight and focused, with lightly firm tannins that do little to obstruct the fruit flow. Long finish, where the more savory elements take back the reins. Super focus and control here. Drink or hold.

A tight nose of bright red and black berries here, with hints of violets and chocolate powder. Medium-bodied with fresh, citrus-like acidity injecting energy and focus. No tannin to speak of until right at the end, where there's a bit of grip. Sustainable. This is fairly uncomplicated and delicious to drink now, but will gain more complexity with another year in bottle.

Wine Advocate – 91

Showing a slightly evolved and savory approach, the Tedeschi 2019 Valpolicella Superiore Ripasso Capitel San Rocco (with 10,000 bottles made) takes the complexity and intensity of a Ripasso up a notch or two. The winemaking team at Tedeschi always does fantastic work. The effect here is smooth and silky with dried cherry and plum.
