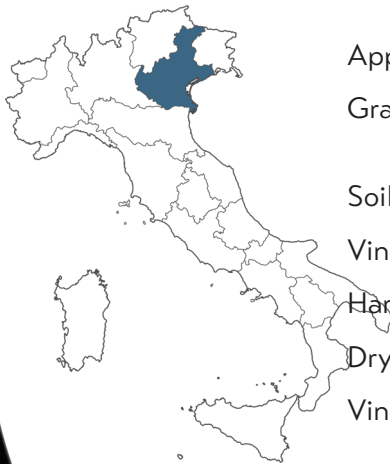


Marne 180

Marne means marl, the variety of soil on which the vineyards are planted; 180 are the degrees of exposure of the vineyards.

This wine is made from grapes harvested in various vineyards located on hills in the Valpolicella area. Different sources and different grape varieties are important to obtain a well-balanced wine.



Appellation:	Amarone della Valpolicella DOCG
Grapes:	Corvina 35%, Corvinone 35%, Rondinella 20%, Other varieties 10%
Soil:	Clay and limestone, rich in skeleton
Vineyard:	20 years (average)
Harvest:	Mid-end September
Drying process:	4 months with a control of humidity
Vinification:	Soft pressing. Alcoholic fermentation for 40–60 days at 15°C (59°F)
Maturation:	30–36 months (Slavonian Oak)
Bottling:	6 months bottle ageing
Alcohol:	16,5%
Sugars:	3 g/l
Total acidity:	6,4 g/l
Dry Extract:	39 g/l

VINTAGE 2020**Vinous – 93+****James Suckling – 93**

The wines from this reliable producer are consistently delicious, in a modern style without ever straying too far into excess. Kirsch, alpine spruce, candied orange zest, violets and camphor. The oak finds confluence with the refined grape tannins to compress the fruit with a welcome restraint. There's a touch of sweetness to the vintage. Age and the complexity that comes with it will serve this wine well. Sustainable. Drink or hold.

Wine Spectator – 92

This structured, medium- to full-bodied red shows good length and tension while still offering expressive notes of sun-dried cherry, dark chocolate, spiced orange peel and smoke. Lively on the palate, with chewy tannins firming the herb-laced finish. Corvina, Corvinone, Rondinella and Rossignola. Drink now through 2035.

VINTAGE 2019**Decanter – 97****James Suckling – 93**

Almost coffee-stained dried red berries on the nose, following through to a full, silky palate with fine tannins that have sunk into the wine nicely, carrying the intense bead of berry and dark cherry fruit through a long finish. Sustainable. Drinkable now, but will improve in the bottle.

Vinous – 92**Wine Enthusiast – 94****Wine Spectator – 91**

A round, supple red, with a generous core of mulled cherry, dried fig, warm brown bread and ashy smoke notes accented by an overtone of dried Mediterranean herbs. Juicy and lightly chewy on the lingering finish, with more smoke, herb and spice elements emerging. Corvina, Corvinone, Rondinella and Rossignola. Drink now through 2029. 12,500 cases made, 600 cases imported. Best from 2027 through 2037. 700 cases made, 100 cases imported.
